UPGRADE OF DISTRICT ROAD D1128 IN VULINDLELA: PHASE III

The Msunduzi Municipality hereby invites tenders for the above works. **Only tenderers with a CIDB Contractor grading of 6CE or higher, who have the relevant expertise, capacity, experience and/or construction equipment, shall be eligible to submit tenders.**

Tender documents shall be available from the Supply Chain Management Unit Offices, 5th Floor, A S Chetty Centre, 333 Church Street, Pietermaritzburg, from **12h00 on Tuesday, 26 August 2014**. A non-refundable tender fee in the amount **R401.28** (including VAT) per document shall be levied. Only cash or bank guaranteed cheques will be accepted.

A **compulsory Clarification Meeting** will take place on **Friday 5 September 2014**. Prospective tenderers shall meet promptly at **10h00** at the service road under the Rail-Over-Road Bridge approximately 400m south of the Hulamin/Afrox traffic signal intersection in Moses Mabhida Road (Edendale Road), from where all will travel in convey to site. Only one compulsory Clarification Meeting will be held. No tender shall be accepted from tenderers who do not attend the above meeting. Tenderers will be required to present their tender document at the Clarification Meeting.

Sealed tenders in accordance with the Conditions of Tender and Tender Data and endorsed on the envelope "**Contract No. SCM 24 of 14/15**" must be placed in the Tender Box located in the Foyer, Ground Floor, City Hall, 169 Chief Albert Luthuli Street (Commercial Road), Pietermaritzburg, not later than **12h00**, on **Friday 12 September 2014**, when they will be publicly opened. Only tenders placed in the Tender Box shall be accepted.

Tender Validity Period: Ninety (90) days commencing from the closing date of tender.

Tender Evaluation Criteria: The tender shall be evaluated on the 90/10 Preferential Points System and in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011 issued in terms of section 5 of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act No. 5 of 2000.

The Msunduzi Municipality does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender, and reserves the right to accept the whole or any part of a tender. Each tenderer will be informed of the tender result. The Msunduzi Municipality expects businesses within the Pietermaritzburg and Midlands Region to support its contract and BEE/SMME initiatives.
