

City observes Mandela Day

On July 18, businesses, organisations, individual community members from Pietermaritzburg came out in numbers to observe the 2016 Nelson Mandela International Day by engaging in a range of activities aimed at assisting communities in need of help. The Nelson Mandela International Day was launched by the UN General Assembly in recognition of Nelson Mandela's birthday on July 18, 2009. It was inspired by a call Mandela made a year earlier, for the next generation to take on the burden of leadership in addressing the world's social injustices when he said that "it is in your hands now". By devoting 67 minutes of their time – one minute for every one of the 67 years Mandela spent fighting apartheid - people can make a small gesture of solidarity with humanity and a step towards a global movement for good. Below are some of the activities that took place in and around Pietermaritzburg on Mandela Day.



As a contribution to the Community Chest Mandela Day campaign, the Tucebon Senior Citizen Club hand knitted over 30 colourful fluffy blankets for charity. The Woodlands based organisation, consisting of 39 elderly members, extended the challenge this year after their successful campaign last year. In honouring Madiba's legacy in 2015, the organisation provided a smile for many underprivileged Woodland's Primary School pupils when they knitted scarves and jerseys matching the school uniform.



Once again the second annual toiletry drive at the KZN National Botanical Garden for Mandela day was a success. The wonderful patrons of the beautiful and tranquil KZN National Botanical Gardens made donations of the toiletries and most of them contributed financially. The Botanical Gardens team went to buy toiletry items and infant formulas and nappies for the infants who reside at the home. The donations were made to the Salvation Army children's home. Further to that the KZN National Botanical Garden's team planted fruit trees and indigenous trees at the home.
