




3rd ANNUAL STREET STORE

There was Cebo Hlubi, a qualified Accountant, a Disabled male working at provincial treasury that gave good advice to all women present on how to advance their businesses. He even advised mothers/parents with disabled children on how to access education with government assistance. Thokozani Shabalala was another young man, who is wheelchair bound but was able to study Social Work Degree at Howard College after being disowned by his parents. He became disabled after meeting with a Bicycle accident that left him paralyzed. All the stories told on the day aimed at encouraging Women with Disabilities to soldier on in their financial struggle.
