ABERDARE LAUNCH OF ABER

2. Mr Monty Reddy is always willing to assist anyone with a substance abuse problem. The Centre is a registered NPO and has people who are in need of recovery staying in. This is the only Recovery Centre in Pietermaritzburg and is run in Ward 34.
3. Mr Reddy also ensures that he takes the persons in recovery to Alcoholics Anonnomys and Narcotics Anonnomys meetings.
4. Our staff received rice, oil, candles, cool drinks, chilli bites, chicken, pizzas, oranges, fruit, cakes, cleaning agents and soap for the Centre.
5. Our sponsors where Willowton Oils, Romans Pizza, Kara Nichas and Food Lovers Market.
6. Staff spent time with the Centre Owner and Manager and Recovering Addicts. The Social Worker talked to them about recovery, the challenges and the way forward. They were very grateful for our presence and for the kindness of the sponsors.
7. The Section has sent out letters with pictures to the sponsors and also is sending them Framed Certificates for always assisting the Section.
8. Sadly though as always, the staff of the HIV/AIDS Section did not attend.
9. After the Recovery Centre the Social Work Staff accompanied HIV/Aids Staff to the Jika Joe Crèche in Ward 33, to assist with a vegetable garden.

VULINDLELA 2017 MANDELA DAY ACTIVITIES REPORT

Every year on 18 July — the day Nelson Mandela was born — the UN asks individuals around the world to mark Nelson Mandela International Day (18 July) by making a difference in their communities. Everyone has the ability and the responsibility to change the world for the better, and Mandela Day is an occasion for everyone to take action and inspire change. For 67 years Nelson Mandela devoted his life to the service of humanity — as a human rights lawyer, a prisoner of conscience, an international peacemaker and the first democratically elected president of a free South Africa. In November 2009, the UN General Assembly declared 18 July “Nelson Mandela International Day” in recognition of the former South African President’s contribution to the culture of peace and freedom.

General Assembly resolution A/RES/64/13 recognizes Nelson Mandela’s values and his dedication to the service of humanity, in the fields of conflict resolution, race relations, the promotion and protection of human rights, reconciliation, gender equality and the rights of children and other vulnerable groups, as well as the fight against poverty and the promotion of social justice. It acknowledges his contribution to the struggle for democracy internationally and the promotion of a culture of peace throughout the world. Below are the activities that took place in the area of Vulindlela, ABM provided refuse bags, cleaning material, paint and gloves and Parks & Recreation provided trucks.
