The Department of Social Development supported by Msunduzi Municipality and other non-profit organisations hosted the uMgungundlovu District Boys Assembly at the Athletics Track Sports Complex.

This two-day event provided a platform for young boys to have a special dialogue addressing issues that affect them every day. The programme wanted to determine fundamental principles that can be instilled in boys to groom or mould them into becoming responsible young men in their communities.

Phumzile Kunene, a Social Worker from DSD raised a concern about the lack of programmes that are tailored specifically for boys, which therefore saw the birth of this initiative. "This programme will run in all municipalities within the uMgungundlovu District, the aim is to allow boys to be able to express themselves, we want them to be part of the discussion about what it entails to be considered a good man, we want to teach them that they must not be a danger to society but instead they must make sure that they protect their families and everyone around them.

The assembly further discussed among other issues, Health, Identity and also offered career guidance.
