ENGAGEMENT WITH H.E AMBASSADOR DR. MUKTAR KEDIR ABDU

The Msunduzi Municipality today had a courtesy call from H.E Ambassador Dr. Muktar Kedir Abdu Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Democratic Republic of Ethiopia. The courtesy call is planned under the framework of Ethio-South Africa bilateral relations, strengthening the existing people-to-people relations.

This engagement was attended by Mayor Mzimkhulu Thebolla, DM Mxolisi Mkhize, ACM Nelisiwe Ngcobo, and GM Sandile Zondi. Dr. Muktar Kedir Abdu said that this relationship is based on true Africanism and Pan-African history.

Dr. Muktar Kedir Abdu expressed his gratitude for the warm welcoming they have received from the South African communities they have so far visited. "South Africa is a great country, we want to strengthen the sisterhood and brotherhood between these two countries". He said Ethiopia sees great potential in the municipality based on service delivery and the infrastructure. "We look forward to creating a relationship between our cities, learning from each other, and also helping our people who are based in the City to not violate bylaws and be law-abiding residents.

Mayor Thebolla said that this relationship will yield positive results since the City will be engaging with Ethiopia to identify best practices that can be adopted to make sure that Ethiopian business people in the city continue to conduct business legally.

DM Mkhize said that the municipality acknowledges this first visit to the City by diplomats. "Your presence will symbolize unity between South Africa and Ethonia".

Baked PMB

Date of the Business Visit: 13 September 2022

Baked PMB is Located at Unit 2, Oldfield Business Park, 1 Haworth Rd, Mkondeni area. They provide tasty treats which can be used as a natural healer, combat anxiety, and provide relaxation and pain relief. These baked products are specifically designed for different uses. Baked PMB started operating in September 2021 and is employing five (5) people locally. The Baked PMB is operating in a rented business industrial park.

Generally, the challenges encountered by businesses in Mkondeni are infrastructure related which include road maintenance, potholes affecting the delivery of goods and services, and electricity blackouts which detrimentally affect production. Baked PMB was very appreciative of the support given to them and having such engagements with the municipality (BR&E Visitations). They were also introduced to the Development Facilitation Committee existence where they present their new ventures and diverse projects.

Steel CO: Steel Supplier PMB
Date of the Business visit: 29 September 2022

Steel Co is located at 15 Sheffield Rd in Willowton Industrial area. Steel Co, are a leading Pietermaritzburg steel supplier and distributor of a wide range of steel products to contractors, competitors, and end users.

They have a wide selection of steel products in stock, distributed within 100km of PMB. Their products include steel bars, steel tubing, rebar, mesh, angle iron, and more. They have their own in-factory lip channel rolling machine and can cut and bend to size. Steel Co is highly recommended as your go-to steel supplier in Pietermaritzburg.



Flat steel bars play a vital role in the construction of Pietermaritzburg building frames. Commercial and industrial structures in PMB make use of flat bar steel to extend and improve the life of buildings and to ensure it remains safe. Steel Co currently employs 40 local people and expansion can create 10 more job opportunities.

Challenges raised at the business meeting visit:

The significant request and challenge from Steel Co are expanding the business either on the Willowton property or in a newly purchased property in Mkondeni. Steel Co urged the municipality to reduce the red tape and turnaround time of the clearance certificate issue, maintenance of infrastructure generally including drainage, water pipe leaks, and waste management to avoid Steel Co relocation to Ballito.

An emphasis on the BR&E visitation program is that it is a team effort that expresses interest in and concern for the issues faced by local businesses in the community.
