PUBLIC PLACE AND STREET NAMING PROCESS



The Municipality continues to engage residents on the Public Place and Street Naming Process. Public consultations have been hosted in a number of wards where roads will be re-named. This project is being led by the Office of the Speaker and that of the Chief Whip.

The Municipality outlines the advantages that will come with officially naming public places and streets in wards including the improvement of service delivery considering that areas will be easily identified using the names that will be recorded in the Municipality's data base.

The Municipality also gives residents permission to name public places and streets after certain individuals to acknowledge them, however no payment will be made to such persons. Families whose names will be used in the street naming process will be given consent forms.

Residents are given an option to compile a list of names, hand it over to the ward councillor who will then present it to council. They can look out for these names which will be published by the Municipality with a 30 day window period to object or approve proposed names.

A PLACE CALLED HOME FOR IMBALI UNIT 14 RESIDENTS



The Human Settlements unit under the Msunduzi Municipality handed over 5 houses to families in Ward 41, Imbali Unit 14. This is part of an ongoing revamp project, where a number of houses will be renovated and handed over to identified beneficiaries. "Building people houses, means the restoration of dignity. What we are witnessing today is the true definition of service delivery".



MAYOR ENCOURAGES IMBALI RESIDENTS TO APPLY FOR INDEGENT STATUS, TO PAY FOR SERVICES



Mayor Cllr Thebolla, the Chief Whip, the Municipal Manager Mapholoba, the Chief Financial Officer, councillors and other officials convened a community engagement at the Imbali, Unit 13 community hall.

Prior to this engagement the Ratepayers and Residents Association met with the Mayor and raised issues faced by the community of Imbali. The purpose of this engagement was to address issues such as service rates and property rates.



The Mayor spoke about the indigent status adding that everyone within the jurisdiction of Msunduzi qualify for the indigent, and this applies to households with an income below the amount of R5700 every month.



TITLE DEED HAND-OVER PROGRAM

Madam Speaker Cllr. Majola, Chairperson of the Sustainable Development Portfolio Committee, Cllr. Sokhela and the municipality's Human Settlements unit handed over a title deed to the Govendar family in Northdale.

"Ours is to congratulate you and prioritize you as one of the elderly in Msunduzi", said Speaker Cllr. Majola.

Mr. Govendar thanked the municipality for the title deed. "I can now rest well knowing I am the owner of this house that I have been living in for the past 42 years" said Govender.



LAC, WAC ON FIGHT AGAINST HIV/AIDS

The Local Aids Council (LAC) and Ward AIDS Committee (WAC) were joined by government departments, NGOs, and other organisations that are involved in a fight against HIV/AIDS in Msunduzi. This engagement took place in Ward 18, where Cllr Buthelezi said he appreciates such engagements as they will bring a way forward on the issue of HIV/AIDS in every ward within Msunduzi's jurisdiction.

"I think we need more campaigns where we will educate people about HIV/AIDS, people need to know where to get tested and the support that exists to support those who test positive, there is a lot of work that still needs to be done in our Wards and this meeting will assist us in paving a way forward in all issues that ward committees are facing when dealing with matters concerning HIV/AIDS", said Cllr

ORIBI FIRE STATION RECEIVES FIREFIGHTING EQUIPMENT

Mayor Cllr Mzimkhulu Thebolla joined Mayor Cllr Zuma of uMgungundlovu District Municipality, SANTAM to a handover of the Hazmat Trailer and firefighting equipment for the Oribi Fire Station.

"We would like to extend a warm welcome to you on behalf of the Msunduzi Municipality at this esteemed event. We consider this equipment to be extremely important as it can save lives, and we are happy that our city has seen such a significant intervention to better serve its citizens", said Thebolla in his opening remarks.

The country has seen a steady increase in the number of disasters triggered by severe and extreme weather events across the country, the KwaZulu-Natal province received significant amounts of rainfall in April-May 2022 that resulted in significant loss of lives, unprecedented damage to infrastructure and disruption of livelihoods. With the uMgungundlovu District Municipality, SANTAM had focused on supporting the fire service to improve its capacity to manage fire risks.

"Our sincere gratitude goes out to SANTAM for their assistance in the community we serve and for their ongoing support in helping us continue to save lives", said Mayor Cllr Mzi Zuma.



RESIDENTS BENEFIT FROM UMNOTHO KUBANTU PROGRAMME



The MEC of Agriculture and Rural Development, Mr S. Zuma was joined by Mayor Cllr Thebolla, and other municipal senior leadership in the hosting of uMnotho kuBantu programme in Imbali Unit 14, ward 41. The Mayor of uMgungundlovu District Municipality Cllr Zondi of uMshwathi Municipality.

The purpose of this programme is to bring the government closer to the people and resolve issues the community is facing. The officials handed over genetic improvement bulls which was given to the local farmers.

"The fight is against poverty and unemployment, we want to be a part of food security and encourage more youth to get involved in agriculture and start farming" said Mayor Thebolla.

The one home one garden is a programme initiated to combat the issue of food security in households, this initiative will be extended to churches and schools where individuals are able to plant and harvest vegetables.

Msunduzi Municipality's Local Economic Development unit under the Small, Micro, Medium Enterprises programme (SMME's) gave 5 recipients tuck shop equipment and groceries, also a lease agreement to trade which was voiced and requested during one on one engagement with the Mayor.



JOY AS IMBALI RESIDENTS RECEIVE TITLE DEEDS

Deputy Mayor Cllr. Mkhize welcomed the MEC Human Settlement, Mr Nkosi at a title handover event that took place in Imbali Unit 14, Ward 41. The MEC was accompanied by iNkosi Mkhize, the officials from the municipality's human settlements unit, government departments and other stakeholders.

"I would like to welcome the MEC, our guests and the community. This event is important to us as the Municipality, as it seeks to change the people's lives through giving them title deeds", said DM Mkhize.

The Deputy Mayor further encouraged the safekeeping of title deeds, emphasizing that the document is not only a piece of paper but confirms ownership of homes.

"The dream of those that fought for our liberation has finally come true. Our late leaders fought for a better life for all. The Human Settlements Department is doing a good job by ensuring service delivery and taking care of the needs of the people", said iNkosi Mkhize.

MEC Nkosi mentioned that the Title Deed Tuesday is the government's brainchild. He said that the government runs this program with the aim of ensuring that people have legal ownership of land and houses through the handing over of title deeds. "Having a title deed is a process, and people attempt to bypass that process by buying houses when they do not have title deeds, and as the department we have come to warn against the selling and buying of RDPs", said MEC Nkosi.

At least over 300 title deeds were handed over to beneficiaries.

The DSD is working with the Municipality to find effective ways to address the challenges that are a result of the abuse of drugs by the young and old within Msunduzi. Ms Mwelase outlined the purpose and the goal of the National Drug Master Plan. "The master plan will guide us on how we can rehabilitate those who are victims of drug abuse. There are measures put in place that will respond to questions of what happens after a person has recovered from drug abuse, what assistance do we offer to prevent a relapse of a recovering drug addict, and how do we prevent the emerging of new drugs in our communities" Mwelase said.

She also said that the Department of Sports, Arts and Culture working together with the Department of Social Department are further working on campaigns and other programs that will create a drug free society. A number of government departments including other organisations will also form part of the National Drug Master Plan to tackle the scourge of drug abuse in communities.

Areas that are identified as hotspots will be visited and prioritised by the LDAC.

Mayor Thebolla thanked all stakeholders from the Public and Private sector in the important work they continue to do and working collaboratively in ensuring the safety within the region.

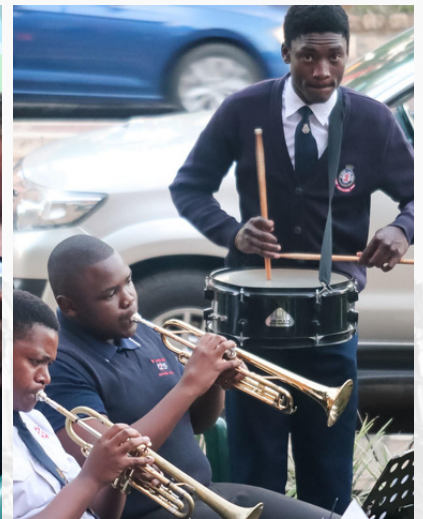
The mayor stressed the importance of everyone using the road safely and complying with traffic laws during this festive season, and went on to discuss the protection of women and children.
