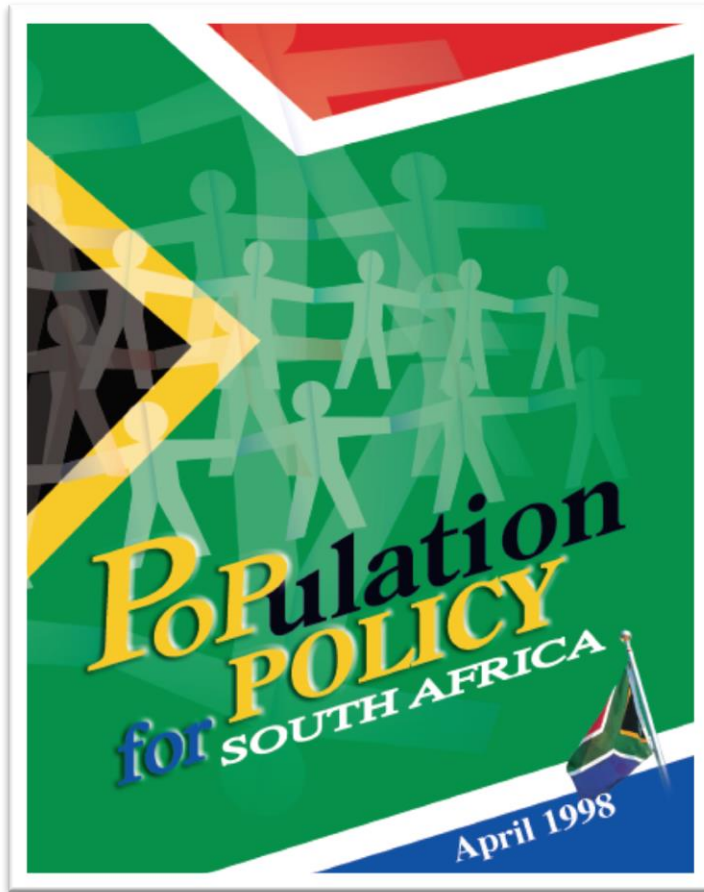

IMPORTANCE OF INCOPORATING DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION INTO IDP's



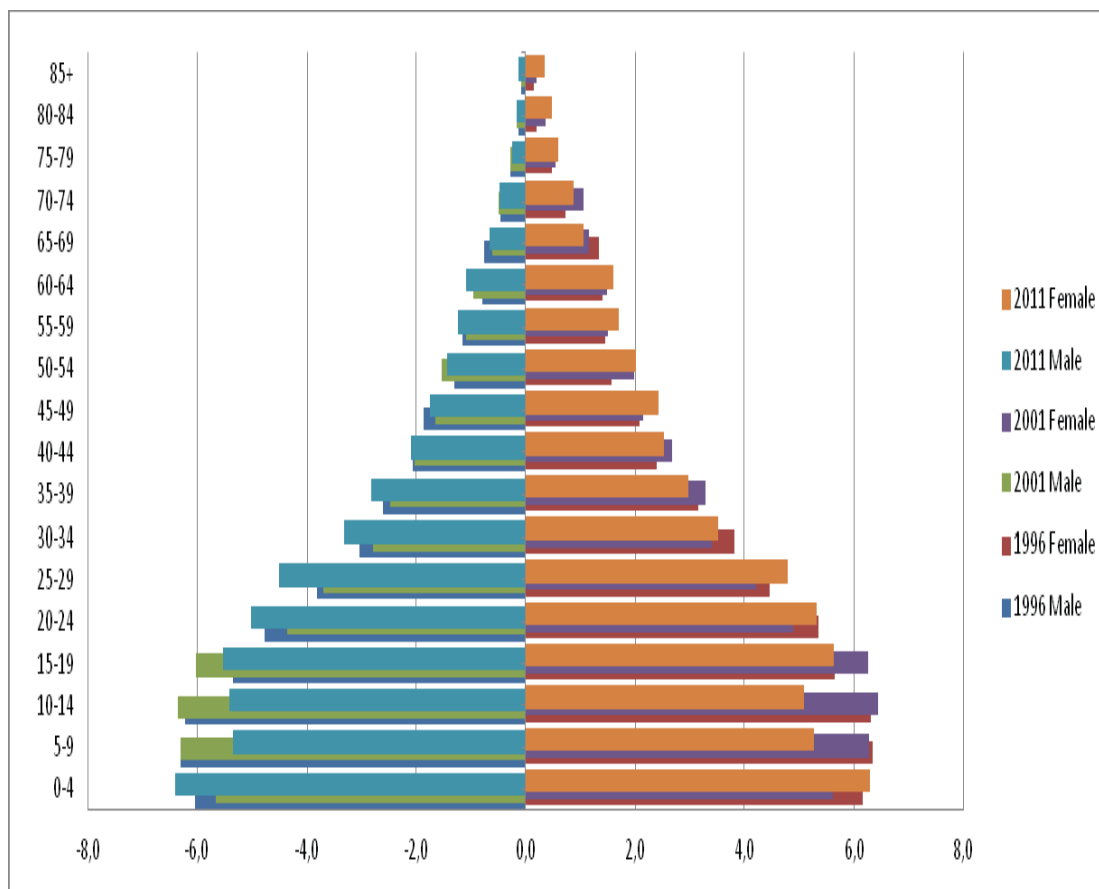

- Population should be a key factor in the formulation of development plans and strategies

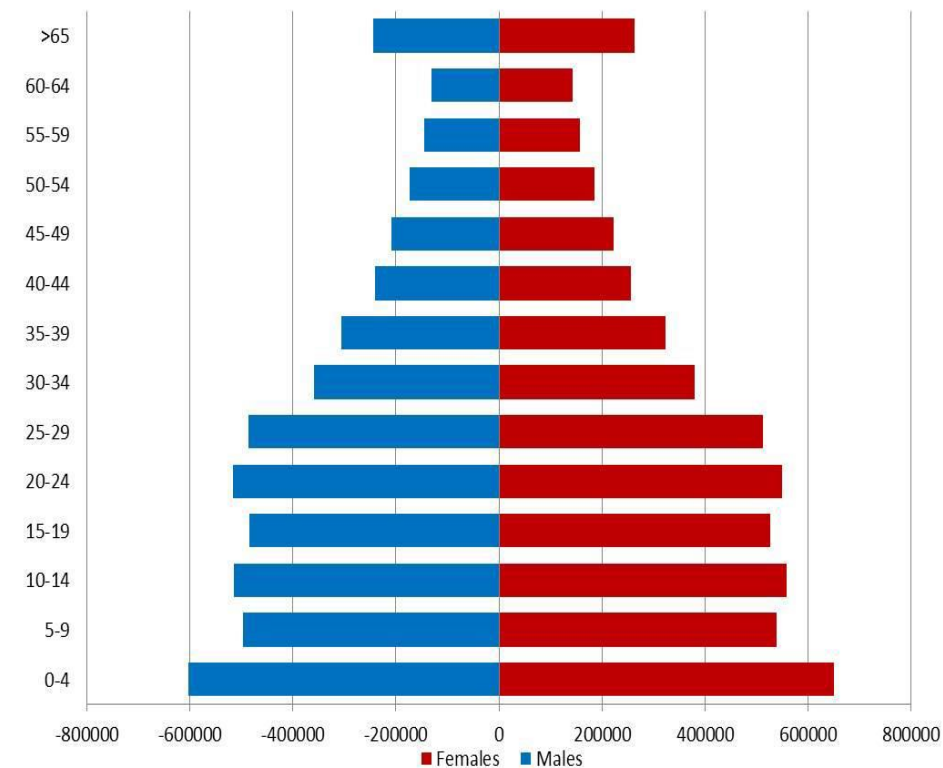
The role of Population Unit is to provide technical support to municipalities in incorporating demographic information into IDP's –to promote people centered development.

Planning and its implications for population

- Planning for human development requires consideration of all aspects of population
- Planning process entails the essential stages of formulation, implementation, modification of policies, strategies, programmes and projects
- Each stage and dimension of planning process calls for the use of population issues and factors.
- Development /Programme managers ought to use demographic information to guide development
- Population information is useful for making feasibility or preliminary assessment of the situation at any level
- Integration of population in development planning involves consideration of population demographic characteristics in national, regional and local

The IDP in page 96 indicates that the LM has more female headed households and therefore programmes for women should be taken greater consideration - Youth = programmes in the implementation plan are commended - Aged= programmes in the implementation plan are commended - No plan for children ? 	
Does IDP reflect Gender equity promoted for access to economic opportunity?	Yes, partly this information is included	
Does the municipality mainstream HIV/AIDS into programmes and plans.	Yes, partly this information is included	

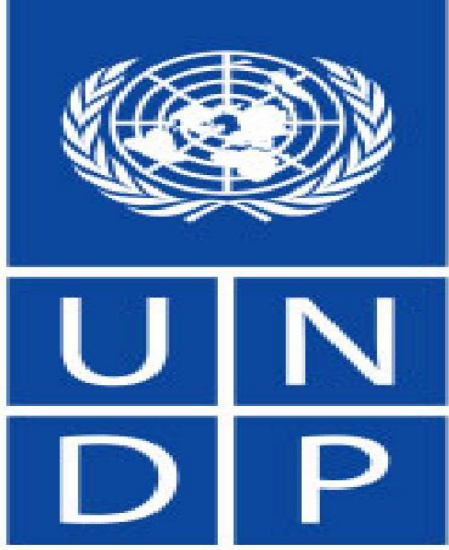
RECOMMENDATIONS
