

#### PUBLIC PLACE AND STREET NAMING PROCESS

The Municipality has been visiting different wards to engage with residents about the Public Place and Street Naming Process. A total of 103 roads are to be named. This project is led by the Office of the Speaker and that of the Chief Whip.

The Municipality outlines the advantages that will come with officially naming public places and streets in the wards including the improvement of service delivery considering that areas will be easily identified using the names that will be recorded in the Municipality's data base.

Msunduzi Municipality gives residents permission to name public places and streets after certain individuals to acknowledge them, however no payment will be made to such persons. Families whose names will be used in the street naming process will be given consent forms.

Residents are given an option to compile a list of names, hand it over to the ward councillor who will then present it to council.

Residents are then advised to look out for these names which will be published by the Municipality followed by a 30 day window period to object or approve proposed names.


#### SPEAKER'S OFFICE ENGAGES WITH WARD COMMITTEE MEMBERS

In advance of the airport's annual licensing audit, the Mayor, Cllr Thebolla, Chairperson for the Sustainable Development Portfolio Committee, Cllr Sokhela and the Municipal Manager, Mr. Mapholoba, visited the airport. This visit aimed to check the airport's compliance with the law. Finance portfolio committee members visited the airport in March to address critical issues facing the airport, and some of those challenges have been resolved since then, such as water, electricity, and the coffee shop.

In terms of Civil Aviation Regulations, Pietermaritzburg Airport operates as a Category 6 airport, a regional airport primarily serving scheduled and non-scheduled flights.

In his remarks, the mayor expressed confidence in the airport's development and again reiterated that in order to ensure that this airport becomes more tourist-friendly and more friendly to all KZN travelers, it will only take the support of all relevant departments. In executing our mandate of the Pietermaritzburg airport, part of our responsibility is to ensure absolute accountability, such as ensuring compliance, safety, operational continuity, and extending the current operating model," said Thebolla.

Amongst the issues noted were illegal dumping, a lack of water, illegal water connections, sewage problems, poor road infrastructure and the lack of drainage protection. Cllr Mkhize said, "We promise the community members that all the issues identified today, will be attended to and resolved"

The deputy mayor also said that this shouldn't simply be a formality, it should also work to resolve problems that our communities are facing.

#### MAYOR THEBOLLA HANDS OVER MEDALS TO SWIMMING CHAMPIONS


