The Msunduzi Municipality hereby invites tenders for the above works. Only tenderers with a CIDB Contractor grading of 3GB or higher, who have the relevant expertise, capacity, experience and/or construction equipment shall be eligible to submit tenders.

Tender documents shall be available from the Supply Chain Management Unit Offices, 5th Floor, A S Chetty Centre, 333 Church Street, Pietermaritzburg, from **14h00 on Monday 4 August 2014**. A non - refundable tender fee in the amount **R401.28** (including VAT) per document shall be levied. Only cash or bank quaranteed cheques will be accepted.

A compulsory Site Inspection Meeting for the above contracts will be held at 10h00 prompt on Wednesday, 13 August 2014, at the Ashburton Library,, 1 Wally Hayward Drive, Ashburton, Pietermaritzburg, 3201. Tenderers shall be required to meet at the entrance of the library on the date and time mentioned above. An official will chair the meeting and answer queries raised by prospective Tenderers. Any amendment to the tender documentation arising from such answers will be circulated in terms of the meeting's Attendance Register. Tenderers who do not attend the above meeting will not be considered.

Sealed tenders in accordance with the Conditions of Tender and Tender Data and endorsed on the envelope "Contract No. SCM 9 of 14/15" must be placed in the Tender Box located in the Foyer, Ground Floor, City Hall, 169 Chief Albert Luthuli Street (Commercial Road), Pietermaritzburg, not later than 12h00, on Tuesday 19 August 2014, when they will be publicly opened. Only tenders placed in the Tender Box shall be accepted.

Tender Validity Period: Ninety (90) days commencing from the closing date of tender.

<u>Tender Evaluation Criteria</u>: The tender shall be evaluated on the 90/10 Preferential Points System and in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011 issued in terms of section 5 of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act No. 5 of 2000.
