Sealed tenders endorsed on the envelope "Quotation No. SCM Q 39 of 11/12" must be placed in the Tender Box located in the Foyer, Ground Floor, City Hall, 169 Chief Albert Luthuli Street, Pietermaritzburg, not later than 12h00 on Friday, 17th February 2012. Only tenders placed in the tender box shall be accepted.

The validity period for which the tender is to hold firm is a period of ninety (90) days from closing date of tender.

Evaluation and adjudication of the tender will be done in line with the Msunduzi Municipality's approved Supply Chain and Preferential Procurement Policies on an 80/20 point system. Adjudication criteria will be as per the tender document; the allocation of points will be done in line with B-BBEE as prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011 pertaining to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, Act No 5 of 2000.
