Tenders are invited from suitably qualified and experienced Tenderers for the above works.

A compulsory Tender Briefing meeting to view samples of the goods and equipment required will be held at 10h00 prompt on **Tuesday, 21 October 2014**, at the Disaster Management Offices, Fire Department, 324 Pietermaritz Street, Pietermaritzburg, 3201. Tenderers shall be required to meet in the Courtyard of the Fire Station on the date and time mentioned above. Only one compulsory Tender Briefing Meeting will be held. No tender shall be accepted from tenderers who do not attend the above meeting.

Sealed tenders endorsed on the envelope "**Supplies & Services Contract No. 66 of 2014**" must be placed in the Tender Box located in the Foyer, Ground Floor, City Hall, 169 Chief Albert Luthuli Street (Commercial Road), Pietermaritzburg, 3201, not later than **14h15 on Thursday, 30 October 2014**, when they will be opened in public. Only tenders placed in the tender box shall be accepted. Under no circumstances whatsoever will any extension of time be allowed for submission of tenders.

Tender Validity period: Four (4) months commencing from the closing date of the tender.

Tender Adjudication/Evaluation Criteria: The tender shall be evaluated on the 90/10 Preferential Points System and in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011 issued in terms of section 5 of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act No. 5 of 2000.

The Council does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender and reserves the right to accept the whole or any part of a tender. Each tenderer will be informed of the tender result. The Council expects businesses within the Pietermaritzburg and Midlands Region to support its contract and affirmative action programmes.
