

#### EFFORTS TO RESTORE LAW AND ORDER IN THE CITY







An infringement operation led by the deputy mayor, joined by the electricity unit employees including the legal services department officials, resulted to a discovery of illegal electricity connections in Raisthorpe, Sukhi Road.

DM Mkhize gave instructions to the team to invade specifically the Privet Road area, where there is informal settlements, with the intention of further conducting more illegal electricity disconnections. Four undocumented foreign nationals were also discovered and detained.

"This operation must yield results, the Municipality is losing revenue due to illegal electricity connections. We are going to work hard to do as much disconnections as possible", emphasised Deputy Mayor Mkhize.

#### MUNICIPALITY YOUTH OFFICE HANDS OVER SPORT EQUIPMENT

### MSUNDUZI JOINS FORCES WITH UMGUNGUNDLOVU ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (UMEDA)

The Acting Municipal Manager Mr. Hlela, alongside officials from the Sustainable and Development Entities and Business Development Unit, signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Msunduzi Municipality and uMgungundlovu Economic Development Agency (UMEDA) on the 5 September 2024, at the City Hall.

The purpose of the MOU is for UMEDA to work in partnership with the Municipality in terms of local economic stability and growth, to work in partnership with business units within the municipality to achieve socioeconomic development objectives of the municipality and implementing strategic sustainable economic projects and programs within the Msunduzi area.

The duration of the MOU is three (3) years. This agreement will assist in fast tracking the implementation of projects, reducing of red tapes and producing efficient service delivery. This agreement falls under the Public-Private Partnership Framework that the municipality had recently adopted which is aimed at creating conducive environment for investment attraction in the city by the municipality working with institutions in the adoption of projects, especially in the infrastructure sector for efficient service delivery.

"While both parties perform their roles and responsibilities and mandates prescribed by the MOU, the city will further benefit on both parties objectives: The City's sound base for business attraction, retention and expansion. but also the creation of employment through promotion and support of local businesses"

The Pietermaritzburg residents can expect world class health care as Midlands Specialists Hospitals opened a new Intensive Care Unit (ICU). The Honorable Deputy Mayor, Cllr Mkhize, attended this intimate gathering, to celebrate the Midlands Specialists Hospital in its advancement as it now will be offering ICU services.

"As the Deputy Mayor of Msunduzi Municipality and Chairperson of the Infrastructure Services Portfolio Committee, which oversees essential services including water, electricity, and road infrastructure, I am delighted to celebrate the opening of the Midlands Specialist Private Hospital's Medical ICU. This milestone underscores the importance of integrating high-quality healthcare with robust infrastructure. I encourage continued collaboration between the hospital board and our municipal services to ensure that we collectively advance the well-being of our community through effective partnerships and mutual support." Deputy Mayor added as he ended his message of support.

The Midlands Private Hospital was built in East Street at a time when there were no private hospital care facilities for non-white people and is the largest private hospital between Durban and Johannesburg.

#### SENIOR OFFICIALS LEAD TEAMS IN OPERATION TO RETURN CITY TO FORMER GLORY

The Mayor led a delegation of leaders and officials in a joint operation targeting hijacked buildings in the city. The m assured residents that the city will return to its former glory. Identity checks were carried out, and individuals without South African citizenship or legal authorization were detained. The Municipality is losing revenue due to illegal connections in hijacked buildings.







Additionally, the deputy mayor led one of the teams involved in an operation where illegal immigrants are being arrested for occupying a building at 104 Masukwane Street.

The CFO Ngcobo including the Revenue Collection Unit, were present to carry out disconnections due to outstanding water and electricity bills amounting to over R16 million owed to the municipality by Ubunye Co-op, which operates as a hostel at 83 Masukwane Street.

"We are here to ensure the enforcement of all our by-laws, working alongside SAPS to thoroughly clean up all hijacked buildings. This operation has been highly successful, and we believe it will inspire confidence and hope among the residents of Pietermaritzburg," said Deputy Mayor Cllr Mkhize.
