MUNICIPALITY SIGNS AGREEMENT WITH SAFCOL

“We have had challenges with forestry management, there were long discussions on possible solutions, with the presence of the Mayor here including his involvement or role in such processes, it clearly suggests that we are committed to bringing change and resolve forestry management issues.”

We share a common goal which amongst other things is to generate revenue and to ensure job creation including ensuring that communities benefit from proper forestry management”, SAFCOL CEO Mr Tsepo Monaheng.

“The Municipality lacked the capacity to manage forestries, with this partnership I foresee a positive outcome and we look forward to working with you”, said Mayor Cllr Thebolla



A CLEANSING CEREMONY FOR CITY OF CHOICE



Mayor Cllr Thebolla joined by uMgungundlovu District Municipality Mayor Cllr Zuma, Speaker Cllr Majola and senior officials of the Municipality were honoured by the presence of iNkosi Nyazilwezulu Shembe, who was in Pietermaritzburg for a cleansing ceremony.

ASSESSMENT OF COMMUNITY HALLS CONSTRUCTION



Speaker Cllr Majola and Chief Whip Dlamini joined Deputy Mayor Cllr Mkhize and his Infrastructure Portfolio Committee members on an oversight visit to Elandskop, France, Madiba and Thembalihle Community Halls, where an inspection of the construction of community halls is undertaken.

The committee was not impressed with the hall construction in ward 8 in Elandskop as work that has been done by the contractor has not been satisfactory and the immediate recommendation of termination of the contract was recommended as they have failed to deliver expected services.



Progress on the halls in wards 7 and 13 received a nod from the officials, with the hall in ward 13 expected to be completed by November. Thembalihle Hall in ward 38 impressed the committee the most as the level of workmanship done on it is of exceptional quality.

Moving forward, more oversight visits will be conducted to ensure the completion of such projects.



TITLE DEED HAND-OVER PROGRAM



The KZN Department of Human Settlements MEC KK Nkosi was joined by Speaker Cllr Majola and Sustainable Development Portfolio Committee Chairperson, Cllr Sokhela at Imbali BB, Unit 13 where the MEC led a handover ceremony of title deeds.

MEC Nkosi announced that on that day the department was launching a programme where on Tuesdays the provincial department of human settlements will be visiting municipalities to handover title deeds to different communities.

"In KZN alone, close to 7000 title deeds will be handed over, and this will make our people official owners of houses that the government has built", said MEC Nkosi.

The MEC made a call to those who receive title deeds, to refrain from renting out RDPs or selling them, emphasizing that the government aims to restore people's dignity by providing secure and comfortable homes.

604 title deeds have already been handed out in Edendale with more still to be handed over as the project continues within Msunduzi Municipality.

MUNICIPALITY SIGNS DEAL TO IMPROVE LANDFILL MANAGEMENT

Municipal Manager Mapholoba welcomed the awarding of a 12 month contract to a new contractor who will be overseeing the management and the operations of the New England Road Landfill Site.

The Municipal Manager was joined by the Chief Whip Sandile Dlamini, Deputy Municipal Managers Wilson Mhlongo and Nosihle Nzama, where the terms and conditions of the contract were read to all the stakeholders and municipal management.

MM Mapholoba mentioned that the awarding and signing of the contract fulfills the commitment the municipality made to EDTEA, other stakeholders including organisations that advocate for the protection of the environment and human rights.

This partnership will ensure that the landfill management team and the contractor conducts daily site meetings where arising issues will be discussed and resolved on the ground.

This is one of the Municipality's efforts to improve the conditions of the New England Road Landfill Site and to ensure compliance with the rules and regulations concerning the operational aspect of the site.



MUNICIPALITY HOSTS INDUCTION PROGRAM

The Municipality's Community Services together with the Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment under the Department of Public Works, extended public works program in the welcoming of new hires at an induction program which took place at the Harry Gwala Stadium. The program aimed to assist the new employees with their transition, and ensure that they have the necessary information and support they need to carry out their duties.

Due to the floods that occurred in the previous year, this program was started in the Municipality to collect refuse waste and create job opportunities.



SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT MONTH OUTREACH PROGRAM

Speaker Cllr Eunice Majola and other Municipality officials joined government officials from the Department of Social Development and other stakeholders, in the launch of the Social Development Month Outreach Program at Imbali Unit 14, Ward 41.

Speaker Cllr Majola applauded officials from Social Development for having programs that speak to social ills, and for taking time to visit communities to have dialogues that seek to find resolutions for challenges that are raised by residents.

The program included a peace walk with residents of ward 41 that began at the Community hall leading to Ezintendeni Sports Ground where the main programme engaging with residents was held concerning issues of GBV, crime, poverty, and further introducing programs that the government has initiated to address societal problems.



DEPARTMENT OF SPORTS, ARTS & CULTURE DONATES SPORTING EQUIPMENT

Mayor Cllr Thebolla welcomed a handover of sporting equipment for pre-schools under Mayoral Special Programmes by the Department of Sports, Arts and Culture at the City Hall. The schools that had the privilege of receiving this prayer were Zululwazi Secondary School, KwaMpande High School and Mtholangqondo Secondary School.


The purpose of this event was to help encourage and motivate grade 12 learners to do their best with focused and clear minds as they will be starting their final exams soon.


WARD COMMITTEE MEMBERS ENGAGEMENT

The Municipality (Library Services) continues to seek ways to uplift people from all walks of life.


