Rapid Response Task Team address water supply challenges

Deputy Mayor Cllr. Mxolisi Mkhize, Speaker Cllr. Eunice Moja, ward councillors, and municipal officials recently visited various wards to assess and address water supply challenges.

The team actively engaged with the Water Department to tackle key issues surrounding reservoirs and illegal connections.

During their visit to Reservoir 18, the team identified illegal direct water connections, which were disrupting access to clean water for other areas. The Municipality and the Water Department worked together to resolve this issue and ensure an uninterrupted water supply.

Ongoing efforts were focused on identifying additional problems and implementing immediate solutions.

In the wards visited, Speaker Cllr. Eunice Moja, as Chairperson of the Rapid Response Task Team, led checks on water reservoirs and raised awareness about the impact of illegal pipe connections.

Residents were urged to stop these unlawful practices, as they disrupted the fair supply of water and created serious challenges for the entire community. The Municipality and the Water Department took steps to remove these illegal connections and ensure water distribution was fair.

Additionally, uMngeni Water announced a reduction in the volume of water supplied to Msunduzi. The Municipality worked closely with the Water Department to ensure this did not negatively impact households, implementing measures to manage resources efficiently and protect residents' access to clean and uninterrupted water.


Book launch for Ubuciko Bezimbongi

The Risk Management, Ethics and Anti-Corruption Workshop took place at City Hall Council Chamber, bringing together Municipal leaders and stakeholders to strengthen ethical governance and accountability in local government. Msunduzi Municipality's Speaker, Cllr Eunice Majola, extended a warm welcome to all stakeholders and leaders, highlighting that the workshop provides a valuable platform to explore strategies for strengthening public trust and promoting sustainable service delivery.

Key areas covered included the fundamentals of risk management and the strategic importance of applying it in local government, highlighting how municipalities can identify risks early and put strategies in place to prevent service disruptions. The session on combating corruption and fraud through investigative support stressed the need transparency and proper systems to protect municipal resources. 
