

Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) site visit

The Msunduzi Municipality welcomed a delegation from the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) for a site visit aimed at exploring potential collaboration in road infrastructure development.

The visit focused on the use of Prostar Paints, a locally manufactured product that was being utilized by the municipality for road marking across Pietermaritzburg. The DRC delegates were particularly interested in understanding how the municipality had integrated this product into its maintenance and urban planning strategies.

As part of the program, municipal officials had accompanied the delegation on a walkabout along Burger Street, showcasing completed road marking projects and sharing insights on application processes, durability, and cost-effectiveness.











Mayor Cllr. Mzimkhulu Thebolla, along with the Business Retention Unit and various other department representatives of Msunduzi, visited Commuter Transport Engineering (CTE) Durban as part of the municipality's business retention programme.

The company primarily provided rehabilitation of railway train coaches, most of which were PRASA assets. Commuter Transport Engineering (CTE) Durban, based in Imbali next to Transnet, had committed to working with the municipality by offering expertise to revitalise railway transport and contributing to the local economy through job opportunities and training programmes for youth in locally based tertiary institutions.

Mayor Cllr. Mzimkhulu Thebolla called upon the organisation to continue collaborating with the Msunduzi Municipality to "play a part in the municipality's plans in revitalising the city through programmes such as Operation ILIMA."









Site visit to Pietermaritzburg Airport

Operation Ilima

As part of Operation Ilima, our city-wide clean-up and bylaw enforcement campaign—Msunduzi Municipality has intensified its efforts to remove illegal outdoor advertising materials across the City. This is a crucial part of our commitment to restoring order, ensuring public safety, and upholding municipal bylaws.

The unauthorised display of advertisements not only clutters and degrades the visual environment of our city but also poses safety hazards to road users and results in revenue loss for the Municipality. As such, all illegal signage is being removed by our teams, with the costs recovered from the responsible parties, as per the Municipal Outdoor Advertising Bylaws.

This crackdown is one of many high-impact interventions under Operation Ilima, which also targets illegal electricity connections, unauthorised structures, unclean environments, and non-compliant businesses.
