The Kwa-Zulu Natal Office of The Premier in collaboration with the Msunduzi Municipality hosted a session at the City Hall, to provide information on the Women Advancement Fund. This program is the national government's brainchild, spear headed by the KZN Premier's Office with the aim of financially uplifting emerging women entrepreneurs and existing businesses.

To qualify for funding, the middle Small, Medium, and Micro Enterprises (SMME) have to meet a certain criteria. The business must be 80% female owned, operate in agriculture and agro-processing manufacturing, retail, technology, healthcare, tourism, energy, renewable energy and maritime. Business owners must also include in their business plan how the business will create job opportunities and demonstrate contribution to the provincial economic growth.

CITY OFFICIALS EMBRACE PORTRAIT DRAWING MACHINE










