MAYOR THEBOLLA ASSESS WORK DONE ON GREYLING STREET

Part of the rehabilitation effort entails the ongoing removal of all obstructions from the road. Additionally, upgrades to the stormwater drainage system, while currently operational, require maintenance to mitigate flood risks effectively. Schools and businesses located along this route will benefit from these repairs, as they will ensure smoother traffic flow and enhanced safety for all road users.
