CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM IMBIZO



Mayor Cllr Thebolla attended the Unpacking of the Criminal Justice System Imbizo at Edendale Lay Ecumenical Centre. This event which was attended by officials from government departments, non-profit organisations, members of the media including other stakeholders was meant to get stakeholders and the community in one space so that they can have a dialogue about the issues that residents face, justice services, to encourage residents to report cases of abuse including sharing of information about resources available to locals as far as the justice system is concerned.

In his speech Thebolla said, the abuse of women and children remains one of major social ills facing communities. The laws designated to protect women and children fail the victims of abuse especially in the rural areas. "We are grateful to the transport department for hosting such events that seek to bring us together so that we can address these issues. One of the police stations in the area has over the years constantly recorded high number of crimes, including that of women and children abuse, now we ask ourselves what can we do to minimise these numbers so that our residents live safely in our communities. We also acknowledge the Domestic Violence Act, but there is a lot that needs to be done to make sure that the law is applicable to all citizens regardless of class".

The Deputy Minister of the Department of Transport Sindi Chikunga spoke on the opening of the Vulindlela service centre saying it will bring services to the door step of residents. "The opening of the centre is of great significance as we are acknowledging the 16 days of activism for no violence against women and children"





INFRASTRUCTURE SERVICES PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE VISITS NHLAZATSHE

Deputy Mayor and Chairperson of Infrastructure Services Portfolio Committee Mxolisi Mkhize joined by local wards is c visited the Nhlazatshe area and engaged with the community on issues of service delivery. The community in Nhlazatshe has been without water and the access roads were greatly affected and washed away by the recent floods.

DM Mkhize presented plans in place to address the water challenge and appealed to the community to not vandalize the infrastructure and illegally connect from the reservoir. The Municipality will be repairing the reservoir and replacing the stolen valves in order for it to fill up to capacity and supply the entire community with clean water.

Mkhize encouraged Councillors to convene community meetings and ensure that the community are updated on progress and challenges relating to service delivery. He introduced a Contractor who will upgrade 1000m access road at Nhlazatshe.

"We commit to work with the Councillor and community of Ward 11 and we will deliver a road that will last the community 3 years" said Warren (Contractor). The access roads in Ward 11 and other wards within Msunduzi. The Municipality remains committed to building better neighborhoods and improving accessibility for communities.

This platform has been created to ensure that the business sector is covered in terms of conducting business. Various organisations gave presentations outlining the services they provide, and questions and answers were shared.




16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM FOR NO VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND CHILDREN




FIRST WALK AWAY 5KM RACE

Mayor Thebolla, Ward 28 Caretaker DM Mkhize and Chief Whip Sandile Dlamini joined City Manager Lulamile Mapholoba and Senior Management in an engagement with the community of Ward 28. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the relocation of flood victims who are currently housed at Truro Hall following the devastating floods that left them homeless.

The community of Ward 28 raised their concerns about the identified land parcel for temporary residential units citing a number of reasons including their safety and the devaluation of their properties within that area. Thebolla urged the community to allow the TRU construction to continue, adding that it would not be beneficial to human nature to have people staying in the hall with their families. "The Municipality is doing everything it can to provide human settlement services to the community. We urge residents to unite to restore dignity for those living at Truro Hall. By working together, we can make South Africa and especially Msunduzi a better place for everyone", said Thebolla.

Speaker Cllr Eunice Majola embarked on a site visit to Ward 2 where the municipality's road and maintenance unit is conducting road construction.


Majola who is also the caretaker of ward 2 has convened several meetings with ward 2 committee members and resolved to prioritise a number of roads that need urgent attention.
