


Population by age - Umgungundlovu





The Msunduzi Population Pyramid



Population by Local Municipality, 2011 and 2016




Municipality Population Growth, 2011-2016




Household dynamics



In 2016 KwaZulu-Natal recorded approximately **2,8 million** households




In KwaZulu – Natal: Households have increased at nearly four times the rate of the Population between 2007 and 2016

Average Household Size, KZN, 2016
















Electricity – for lighting



Type of dwellings occupied by households, 2011-2016




Access to Improved Sanitation, 2011-2016





Highest level of education (Umgungundlovu Municipalities)





The four dimensions of poverty




Umgungundlovu Poverty headcount and Intensity by, 2011-2016




37,5% of KZN working age population are employed and the unemployment rate for 2018 was **22**

Percentage 15 – 64 year olds employed




The percentage of employed persons has increased by **3,1** percentage points from 2001 to 2011

The unemployment rate has reduced from **46,3** in 2001 to **30,4** in 2011.


Unemployment rate is defined as the number of unemployed persons divided by the labour force (employed + unemployed persons)



*The use of internet facilities by the population has increased from **5,4%** in 2007 to **9,5%** in 2016.*

*Access to television has increased from **70,8%** in 2007 to **87,8%** in 2016.*

Conclusion

- Demographic characteristics indicate that Umgungundlovu have a high share of youth that are of working age (e.g. 24 – 34) and Umsunduzi resemble the district.
- The average household size for the districts was almost 4 thus indicating more nuclear households.
- Over 70% of households are formal type followed informal dwellings.
- The unemployment rate has reduced from 46,3 in 2001 to 30,4 in 2018.
- **93,5%** of workers who reside in PMB work in there, **6,5%** work outside of PMB and **10,9%** are from other districts
