T1.1 TENDER NOTICE AND INVITATION TO TENDER

Tenders are invited from suitably qualified and experienced Tenderers who have a **CIDB Contractor Grading of 7 CE or higher** to submit tenders for the above works.

Tender documents shall be available from the Supply Chain Management Offices, 5th Floor, A. S. Chetty Building, 333 Church Street, Pietermaritzburg, from **Thursday 25 April-2013**. A non- refundable tender fee in the amount **R600.78** per document shall be levied. Only cash or bank guaranteed cheques will be accepted.

A **compulsory Clarification Meeting** will take place on **Thursday, 02 May 2013**. Prospective tenderers shall meet promptly at **10h00** at the Harry Gwala Stadium, Princess Margaret Drive, Alexandra Park, Scottsville, Pietermaritzburg, and thereafter proceed in convoy to site. Only one compulsory Clarification Meeting will be held. No tender shall be accepted from tenderers who do not attend the above meeting. Tenderers will be required to present their tender document at the Clarification Meeting.

Sealed tenders endorsed on the envelope “**Specialised Contract No. SCM 55 of 12/13**” must be placed in the Tender Box located in the Foyer, Ground Floor, City Hall, 169 Chief Albert Luthuli Street (Commercial Road), Pietermaritzburg, 3201, not later than **12h00 on Friday, 24 May 2013**, when they will be opened in public. Only tenders placed in the tender box shall be accepted. Under no circumstances whatsoever will any extension of time be allowed for submission of tenders.

Tender Validity period: Three (3) months commencing from the closing date of the tender.

Tender Adjudication/Evaluation Criteria: The tender shall be evaluated on a Two Stage Evaluation System. Stage 1 being Functionality and Stage 2 based on the 90/10 Preferential Points System in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011 issued in terms of section 5 of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act No. 5 of 2000.

The Council does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender and reserves the right to accept the whole or any part of a tender. Each tenderer will be informed of the tender result.

The Council expects businesses within the Pietermaritzburg and Midlands Region to support its contract and affirmative action programmes.
