# City forges ahead with eMatsheni development

The City's plan to develop the eMatsheni Beer Hall has taken another step forward with the closure and eviction of tenants.

Over the past few years the precinct in Retief Street has become a haven of crime, filth, drugs and violence making it a hot spot for illegal activities, threatening the operations of other businesses in the areas.

The development of the eMatsheni has been in the pipeline for a while and was brought before a full council a few months ago. Soon thereafter a public notice was advertised to indicate its eventual closure and reconstruction. According to Sustainable Development & City Enterprises General Manager Dr. Ray Ngcobo, eMatsheni will be a hub for traditional medicine selling vendors - a concept that is common in major cities such as Durban and Johannesburg.

Following the closure in December, the municipality has issued an invite to credible and competent developers to put forward their proposals to revitalise the precinct in a bid to ensure that the area is redeveloped in line with the city's plans.

In one of the Exco and full council meetings councillors were

told of the concerns about crime in the precinct, which according to a 2016 SAPS report contributed to about 50% of crime in the city.

"The Msunduzi Municipality, in line with urban planning and city place-making, intends to pursue the gentrification and revitalisation of the eMatsheni Beer Hall Precinct, an area situated

within the lower down town of the central business district," said the municipality in a statement released in early January.

"Likewise, the statement continued, it is the intention of the municipality to declare the precinct a special business area within the provisions of the Pietermaritzburg Town Planning

Scheme and which closely resembles the inherent characteristics of an urban development zone,

"Developers will be selected in accordance with the procedures set out in the current edition of the Msunduzi Municipality's Supply Chain Management processes," the statement concluded.

Tender documents were made

available from the Supply Chain Management Unit Offices at the AS Chetty Building and a compulsory tender briefing meeting was held.

It is expected that after careful consideration and scrutiny the winning bidder will be announced prompting the next phase of the project.

## Mayor encourages healthy lifestyle

Msunduzi Mayor Themba Njilo is encouraging residents to exercise often in order to live a healthy lifestyle.

As part of this commitment he has started an aerobics class at the Carbineer Gardens next to the City Hall where municipal staff, including the mayor, will enjoy a one hour workout.

Speaking to *Msunduzi News* the mayor said it was everyone's responsibility to look after their bodies.

"When you exercise your mind, your body functions better and your thought process is better. That is why I advise everyone to engage in some form of exercise," said the mayor.

He encouraged young people to be part of the venture adding

to exercise without having to fork out any money.

The aerobics class is run from 5-6pm each afternoon and everyone is welcomed to join.

## City to purchase own plant equipment worth R24,5 million

The municipality will purchase its own equipment and machinery in order to save money on hiring in a move that will boost its infrastructure development. Chief Financial Officer (CFO) Nelly Ngcobo informed the Executive Committee recently.

She revealed this in a meeting to discuss the mid-term budget, where it emerged that R24,5 million has been set aside to purchase such equipment.

"We have opted to purchase our own plant equipment because huge sums of money is being spent on hiring this equipment," said Ngcobo to Exco members.

With many infrastructure development projects in the pipeline,

it is believed that having their own equipment will also fast track such activities.

In addition to this, the CFO told Exco members that R50 million has also been set aside for infrastructure rehabilitation. The funds will assist in reviving critical areas such as water infrastructure, especially pipes and taps.

The money will also help with electricity infrastructure where money will be used for the replacement of conductors and transformers where necessary.

Exco member Sphamandla Khumalo applauded the allocation of such funds saying it displayed the municipality's commitment to ensuring that the city has world class infrastructure which will also help in attracting investors.

# Mayor reaffirms commitment to serve City residents

**M**munduzi Mayor Themba Njilo has reaffirmed his and Council's commitment to go the extra mile in a bid to ensure that the capital city's residents enjoy the best services from the municipality. He gave this undertaking when he tabled a report unpacking the first 100 days in office. Part of the mayor's report included:

- meeting with a range of stakeholders in order to determine what each one of them expected from the municipality
- Presiding over the Service Excellence Awards
- Conducting an oversight visit with Human Settlements MEC Ravi Pillay in Vulindlela
- Facilitating a Father and Son Conference in September.
- Visit with the Disaster Management team to houses that were affected by the hailstorm in October.
- Donating a swimming pool to Mthethomusha Primary School in Edendale.

One of the stakeholders singled out by the mayor was Safe City, one of Pietermaritzburg's flagship projects that have ensured that crime is under constant surveillance as well as the South African Police Services.

"Safe City continues to play a watchful eye over Pietermaritzburg. We are

encouraged by the good working relationship that has been strengthened," said the mayor. He added that the engagement illustrated the commitment made during the inauguration to be open to dialogue with everyone in the municipality. He pointed out the meeting with staff members as part of the plan of having a motivated workforce that will in turn deliver the best service possible.

Njilo acknowledged that

he had learnt a lot from other councillors who assisted him in acclimatizing to the new role.

"I would like to thank Deputy Mayor Thobani Zuma for taking me through so many things that I had to grasp and deal with in a short space of time," said Njilo. The mayor described Zuma as a humble man who puts the interests of the people ahead of his.

The report was unanimously approved.

## Poor households to benefit from indigent policy

**N**early ten thousand households within the Msunduzi municipality are benefitting from a range of free basic services, according to the latest Back to Basics report tabled before a full council sitting on January 25.

The report that was presented by Acting Municipal Manager Sizwe Hadebe gave a snapshot of government's commitment to assisting poor and vulnerable households by ensuring that they also enjoy access to basic services.

The report to council indicates that :

• 5363 households enjoy use of free water.

• 4340 have access to free electricity

• 9922 do not pay property rates because of the municipality policy

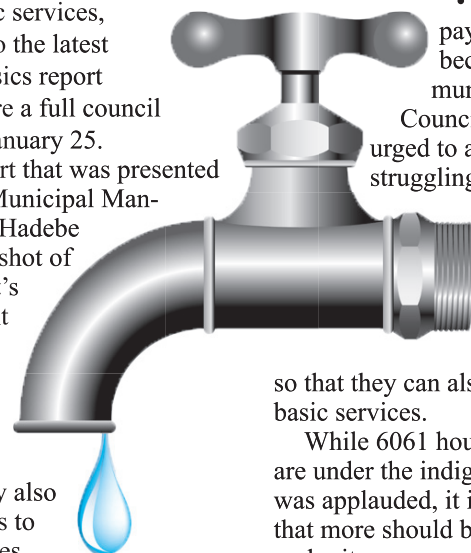
Councillors have been urged to assist other struggling households

by ensuring that they are entered into the indigent programme if they qualify

so that they can also enjoy free basic services.

While 6061 households who are under the indigent policy was applauded, it is believed that more should be incorporated under it.

Council noted and unanimously approved the report.



## Plans to improve audit outcome

**M**sunduzi Municipality Speaker Jabu Ngubo has applauded the response from councillors who have committed to ensuring that the municipality's financial performance improves in future. This is after the office of the Auditor General (AG) indicated that the municipality achieved a qualified audit opinion.

"I am glad that councillors are offering advice and this means that they are taking ownership of the report, that is important for us to work as a team," said Ngubo at a council sitting.

The municipality has acknowledged the AG's report and set out a plan aimed at rectifying the problems highlighted in it.

The outcomes that were received pertain to receivables, payables from exchange transactions, revenue from fines, commitments and contingent liabilities.

In addressing the issues raised,

a weekly task team and monthly transformation committee will be revived to address all issues, root causes and deficiencies on the system of internal control. The action plan has been developed with strict deadlines addressing all audit findings.

The Acting MM has also set up a clean audit task team that meets weekly to address audit findings. This task team includes heads of all Business Units together with Senior Managers in Financial Services.

It will report monthly to the Strategic Committee and Audit Committee monitored by Internal Audit. Action plan addressing material under spending of budget has been developed and is currently being implemented. A detailed report with detailed audit findings and action plans is expected at the next sitting of the full council after all committees have discussed it.

## Refuse collection operation expands

**M**sunduzi Municipality collects refuse from 120 000 households thereby ensuring that hygiene standards are maintained in areas falling under its jurisdiction.

A report tabled at a recent council sitting further revealed that:

- 1840 kilometres of road are maintained by the municipality.

- 4, 7 kilometres of new roads were built in December.
- Refuse removal takes place on a weekly basis in all parts of the municipality. The report forms part of the Back to Basics programme that places emphasis on the importance of reporting regularly on the progress made in meeting people's needs. Back to Basics is built on five

- pillars that are:
  - Putting people and their concerns first.
  - Demonstrating good governance and administration.
  - Delivering municipal services.
  - Sound financial management and accounting.
  - Sound institutional and administrative capabilities.
- The report was approved by council.



## Task team to deal with errant customers

A new task team comprising of Msunduzi Municipality officials will be assembled with the sole task of dealing with non-paying customers.

Executive Committee Chief Financial Officer Nelly Ngcobo announced at a recent meeting that the multi-disciplinary team will discuss and develop a plan to recover millions of rands owed to the municipality.

Msunduzi is owed more than R1,7 billion by government departments, businesses and individual households - which if recovered - can result in the municipality embarking on more development projects that would raise the city profile.

"We have identified certain businesses that owe the municipality a lot of money and are not paying.

We now have our sights on them and households," said Ngcobo.

Msunduzi Mayor Themba Njilo has been emphatic in preaching the gospel of paying for services rendered.

"Remember that if you pay for water and electricity it means that the municipality has more money to build roads and carry out other development projects, so please do the right thing," he told community members during izimbizo that were hosted in different parts of the municipality.

The team will be located in the office of the City Manager and will report regularly on the progress made in recovering outstanding debt.

## Traffic department to flex more muscle

Acting Municipal Manager Sizwe Hadebe has expressed confidence at the new recruits in the traffic department, saying they possess all the necessary skills to make the department more efficient.

He said this when briefing a full council sitting on January 25 at the council chambers.

According to Hadebe, twenty traffic wardens met the minimum requirements to attend the KZN Provincial Department of Transport Traffic Training College. The 20 officers were part of the group that graduated in December at a ceremony for student traffic officers.

The ceremony included a passing out parade and was held at 240 Burger Street and was attended by Transport, Community Safety and Liaison MEC Mxolisi Kaunda who was the guest of honour.

"All twenty traffic officials successfully completed their

training course and obtained a traffic officer's diploma," said Hadebe in his report.

Special awards were given to officers for their outstanding achievements throughout the 2016 training year for different categories. Out of the eleven special awards given out by

the Traffic Training College, Msunduzi Traffic Officials received eight, including Top Student of the year.

"The new officers will strengthen capacity of the department and ensure that traffic rules are enforced and obeyed by all road users," said Hadebe.

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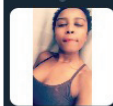
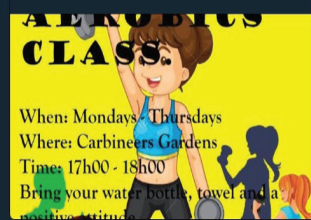

## Stadium construction back on track



The multimillion rand athletics stadium that is nearing completion now that the Msunduzi Municipality has provided a R10 million financial injection.

Construction of the city's multi-million rand athletics track is set to resume shortly following the allocation of funds to the project. The track is one of a few in the province to be sanctioned by the International Amateur Athletics Federation (IAAF) and is expected to be used for both national and international competitions.

Members of the Executive Committee(Exco) were told in a meeting this month(January) that R10 million has been set aside to ensure the continuation of the track's construction. Construction of the track was halted last year
