Power saboteurs will be arrested, promises Mayor

Msunduzi Mayor Themba Njilo says rogue elements among staff members are responsible for the power supply problems experienced in the KZN capital in the last two weeks.

Some residents of Pietermaritzburg have had problems in receiving water and electricity, and this led to unrest in areas such as the Imbali Township and Sweetwaters.

At a press briefing that was attended by senior officials on Tuesday, June 27, Njilo labelled the disruptions as one of the worst he had ever witnessed.

“The service interruptions have caused untold damage and suffering to many communities and businesses. They are believed to be acts of sabotage.

“While the reason for them is as yet unknown to the municipality, we have enlisted the services of law enforcement agencies to identify the perpetrators and bring them to justice,” said Njilo, equating the disruptions to treason.

He told the media that important leads were being followed.

“Arrests are imminent and we assure the public that in addition to pursuing the perpetrators, the municipality is hard at work towards restoring all municipal services to their pre-crisis levels.

“The damage to electrical wiring and other public infrastructure has been considerable but we are working around the clock to ensure that all key connections are restored. To date we have been able to restore power to many areas that were affected,” the mayor added.

According to Njilo acts of sabotage included the petrol bombing of a power sub-station, damaging of water pipes and theft of power cables.

This had prompted the municipality to enlist the services of private security personnel to curb any form of sabotage, a move that he conceded was costly.

“This is a costly exercise but it is absolutely necessary to ensure that our supply of

electricity and water – on which electrical blackouts have had a knock-on effect since water pumps are operated by electricity – reaches every community within Msunduzi that relies on our

services,” stressed the mayor.

He appealed for calm from residents, assuring them that services would return to normality soon.

“We also express our

unreserved apology to all residents within Msunduzi.

“We apologise sincerely for all the inconvenience experienced by private individuals, businesses and institutions,” said the mayor.

will not condone it. We continue to battle this challenge that also has the hallmarks of inside hands – something that we can not go into detail about at this stage.

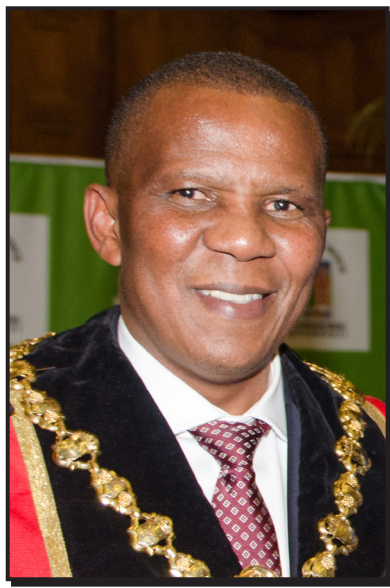

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Bylaws explained

An overview of Msunduzi municipality bylaws

Bylaws are a type of law, and specifically a type of regulation made by a municipal council, rather than the other two spheres of government (i.e. provincial and national government) to regulate the affairs of the municipality and ensure compliance by municipal citizens to certain, pre-determined standards.

Bylaws also protect the safety, health and welfare of municipal residents as the Municipality discharges its business to meet their developmental needs.

Bylaws are passed by the Municipal Council into law to regulate the affairs and the services that the municipality provides in its area of jurisdiction.

A municipality derives the power to pass a by-law from the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, which gives specified powers and competencies to local government as set out in Part B of Schedule 4 and Part B of Schedule 5 as well as the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act No.32 of 2000.

Enforcement of Municipal Bylaws

Bylaws declare certain acts as criminal acts. Bylaws that are formally passed by a municipal council have the same force of law as National and Provincial legislation; and as such the significance of the legislative authority of municipal councils is paramount.

Bylaws can be enforced by courts of law and bylaws transgressors can be criminally charged and punished.

At the same time, the mere fact that a bylaw provides for criminal prosecution for an infringement does not prevent a municipality from obtaining an interdict from the High Court in order to prevent an infringement occurring.

In this sense, bylaws have a preventative potential which may be used as a broader crime prevention framework.

The court in which municipal council has most experience is the Magistrate's Court. The Magistrate's court is where the infringements or contraventions of bylaws are heard and as a

consequence are enforced Common Bylaw Infringement Sanctions

Contravention of bylaws results in the imposition of sanctions by the Municipal Council against any offender as follows: Notice issuance outlining the nature of the infringement

Failure to comply with the Notice results in issuance and service of summons for the offender to appear before court

Failure to respond to summons requesting the offender to appear before court results in issuance of a warrant of arrest by the Magistrates Court.

Synopsis of Msunduzi Municipality Bylaws

The Msunduzi Municipality has several bylaws that are used to communicate municipal rules and expected standards for the community. They are enacted to maintain consistency and transparency in the running of the affairs of the Municipality towards its citizens.

The main purpose of bylaws is to ensure that the Msunduzi Municipality is an orderly city to



live in, work in and do business in, as well as to ensure that certain anti-communal or anti-social behaviour are prohibited and punished if displayed.

The Legal Services Unit within Corporate Services Business Unit is the custodian of all Council bylaws drafted, passed and enforced by the Msunduzi Municipality.

All bylaws are reviewed regularly by Legal Services to ensure that they are kept up to date and aligned to current and new developments in the Municipality, as well as developmental priorities.

Twenty three (23) bylaws have been drafted or reviewed in the past three, culminating in the Msunduzi Council formally adopting these bylaws.

In the near future we will give a breakdown of the bylaws.

City welcomes new aircraft

Agrowing demand for air travel between Pietermaritzburg and Johannesburg has prompted SA Airlink to introduce a 98-seater Embraer jet with business class facilities to its fleet of aircraft linking the provincial capital to the country's economic hub.

Deputy City Manager: Sustainable Development and City Entities Dr Ray Ngcobo said the move was a positive one, with far reaching implications for the city.

"We have been in discussions with SA Airlink for a while over the matter. Now that it has come

to fruition, we are quite delighted as the City, because it shows growth," said Dr Ngcobo. He added that the introduction of the larger jet would cater for growing business activity in the KZN capital.

Karin Murray, marketing and sale's manager for SA Airlink confirmed that the airline had introduced the Embraer 190 jet to the route saying the plane had done well on a test flight and landing in Pietermaritzburg.

"The unique operational proficiency of this aircraft will broaden Airlink's horizons to include smaller

community destinations such as Pietermaritzburg," said Murray.

Pietermaritzburg Chamber of Business CEO Melanie Veness also expressed her delight over the introduction of the new aircraft by SA Airlink.

Pietermaritzburg Airport manager Nontobeko Mofokeng and her staff were delighted with the new Embraer touching down earlier in June, saying the airline's decision to invest in the new larger aircraft indicated growing confidence in the city and growing passenger demand. "There was excitement galore at the airport.

We all want growth and better

service delivery and Airlink's decision to introduce the larger plane certainly is a thumbs-up for everyone in the city.

It is good news for the city socially and economically," said Mofokeng.

In February this year, Airlink introduced a new route linking the KZN capital to Cape Town using one of its 20 Embraer 135, 37 seat regional jet aircraft.

Sustainable Development and City Entities committee chairperson Eunice Zondi welcomed the introduction of the new jet.

"This is further confirmation

that our city is growing and with it comes the demand for more travel and larger aircraft.

We think the move by SA Airlink is a wise one and will have a far reaching impact for local travel," she said.

SA Airlink which was formed in the 1980's with the merger of Magnum Airlines, Border Air and City Air, has developed into South Africa's first feeder network, specifically aimed at linking the smaller towns, the regional centres and hubs throughout South Africa and carries approximately 1 400 000 passengers annually.

"In November 2015 we hosted then National Deputy Minister of Tourism Thokozile Xasa who launched emerging businesses in transport and accommodation subsectors.

Today's achievement gives impetus to the Gidla Express

Programme in particular" said Dumisani Mhlongo- Director of Msunduzi Pietermaritzburg Tourism Association. Gidla Express is a local managed Homestays Programme aimed at catering for accommodation overflow, diversification of local tourism products and encouraging access to tourism sector.

Phumzile Kedama, Cathsseta Board Chairman, and David Gengan, Msunduzi Municipality Tourism Manager, pledged support for Cathsseta and Msunduzi Municipality respectively.

Around the clock traffic services to be rolled out

Msunduzi Municipality will soon roll out an around the clock traffic service in line with the traffic demands of the growing city. This was revealed by Deputy Municipal Manager Community Services Boniwe Zulu at a recent Exco meeting.

Currently the City has no 24-hour traffic service but municipal spokesperson Thobeka Mafumbatha has made assurances that there are traffic officers on standby.

The City would be rolling out plans this year to address the issue of filling critical posts in the traffic police unit while also acquiring the tools of trade in order to roll out the 24/7 shift in due course. A council resolution was passed to ensure 24-hours traffic service is implemented in the jurisdiction of the municipality.

The City, and its traffic services, are extremely concerned about the number of lives lost in road collisions.

Gandhi's teachings are just as relevant today

The City once again played host to the annual commemoration of Mahatma Gandhi's seminal incident of being thrown off the train at the Pietermaritzburg Railway station on June 7, 1893.

The station has become a landmark in the city to international visitors following the historic episode.

This year Consul General of India (Durban) Dr Shashank Vikram said rising levels of global conflict and violence made the philosophy and teachings of Mahatma Gandhi as relevant today as it was over seven decades ago when he led campaigns across two continents against colonial oppression and racial subjugation.

Dr Vikram said this when he delivered the keynote address at the station.

He said the privilege of paying homage to Gandhi at the physical site of such a significant moment in Gandhi's life, was a "surreal" moment as growing up in India included learning about Gandhi's role in the struggle for India's freedom and his impact on world history.

"The people and Government of the Republic of India owe South Africa and its people a debt of gratitude for preserving and sustaining this legacy and we pay tribute specifically for the role of the Pietermaritzburg Gandhi

Memorial Committee (PGMC) for persevering this legacy," said Dr Vikram.

Programme director and deputy president of the PGMC Irshad Motala described Gandhi's physical eviction from the 1st class carriage as a "callous and racist act" that was catalyst for not just Gandhi's transformation into an activist but eventually as a catalyst for change in the course of world history. Senior municipal manager David Gengan, who is also the chairman of the PGMC stressed the importance of continually telling the story of our history to "avoid the risk of history fading away".

"It is critical to tell the story, as

we do every year on the same day, June 7th, that Gandhi was evicted right here at this spot. If we do not keep our history alive, we run the risk of our history fading away and future generations will not know who figures such as Gandhi, Mandela, AS Chetty and others were," said Gengan highlighting that the PGMC had assembled a comprehensive collection of all Gandhi's writings that is accessible to anyone wanting to deepen their understanding of his teachings. The proceedings closed with Gengan, Dr Vikram and PGMC life president Kay Makan laying a commemorative wreath at the plinth marking the spot Gandhi was evicted from the train.

Msunduzi Voortrekker Museum



who modelled it on schools in England and Europe.

Various displays are mounted in sections of this building, including the History of Pietermaritzburg, Tapestry of Cultures, Birth of Democracy and Prince Imperial displays. The museum recently acquired a beautiful Herb garden, and visitors can also see a traditional Zulu hut and a small private Hindu temple on site.

Relics of note include the second oldest ox-wagon in South Africa (1824); original Voortrekker clothing; authentic rifles; a prayer book belonging to former Voortrekker leader Piet Retief; genuine lifestyle memorabilia; a replica of a Hindu Shiva; the original house of Andries Pretorius who was

a victorious commander at the Battle of the Blood River; artefacts; sculptures; collage of the role of the African people in the Boer War (Farmer War); African beads from the Royal Residence of King Dingane as well as King Dingane's carved chair and headrest.

Located at 351 Longmarket Street, Pietermaritzburg, it became the property of the Voortrekker museum in 1985. Also housed in this building are the reception, gift shop, staff offices, library and auditorium. This is one of the oldest original Voortrekker houses built in Pietermaritzburg, and dates from the early 1840's.

The Msunduzi Museum in Pietermaritzburg is an agency of the National Department of Arts and Culture and has been transformed from a historically single-themed museum to one that depicts the heritage of different cultural groups of KwaZulu-Natal.

The museum was created in 1912 as a tribute to the

Voortrekkers. Voortrekker history is the main focus in the Voortrekker Complex - the historic Church of the Vow, the Andries Pretorius House and the E.G. Jansen Extension. The Voortrekker Complex. Anglo-Boer War exhibitions are housed in original 1849 Voortrekker architecture at 333 Boom Street.

The Voortrekker Memorial

Church and historic Church Hall were also recently acquired for the Museum by the National Department of Arts and Culture. The Museum's Main Building was originally the Longmarket Street Girls Primary School – until 1972, when the school moved to its current premises. It was built in 1905 according to a design by architect AE Dainton,

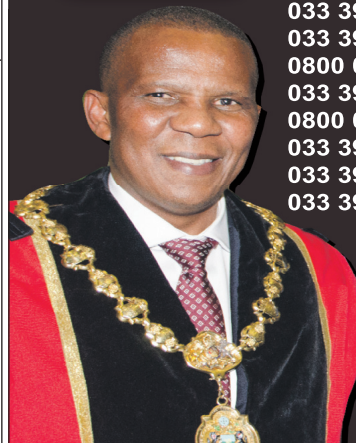
