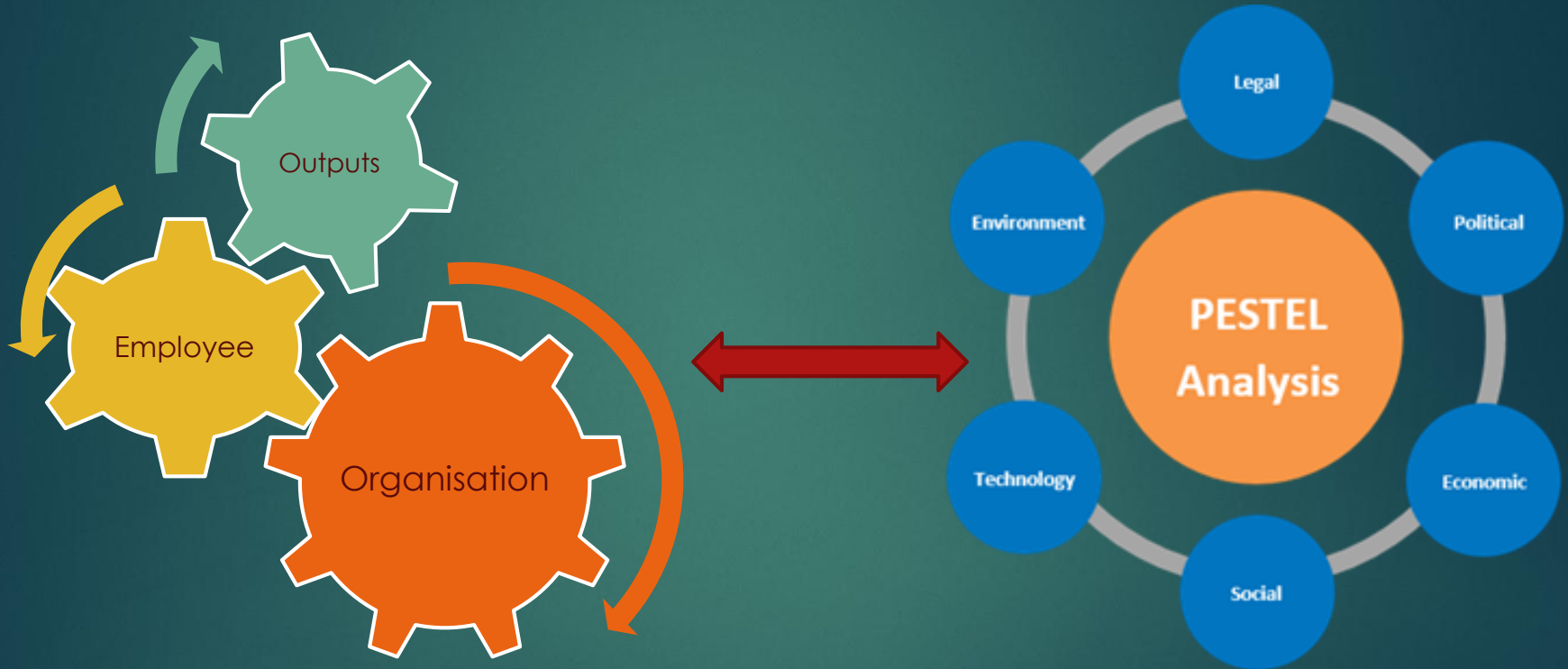

Africa Falling

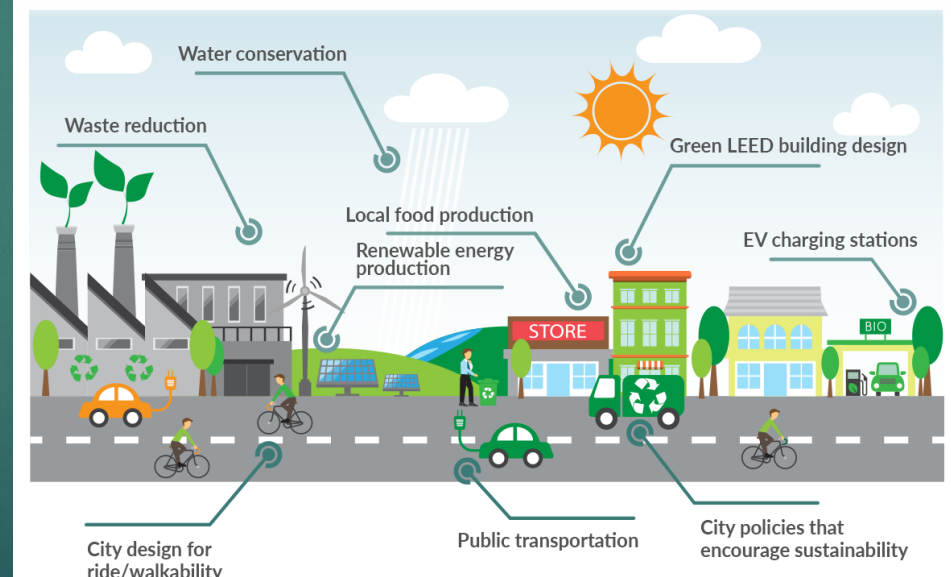
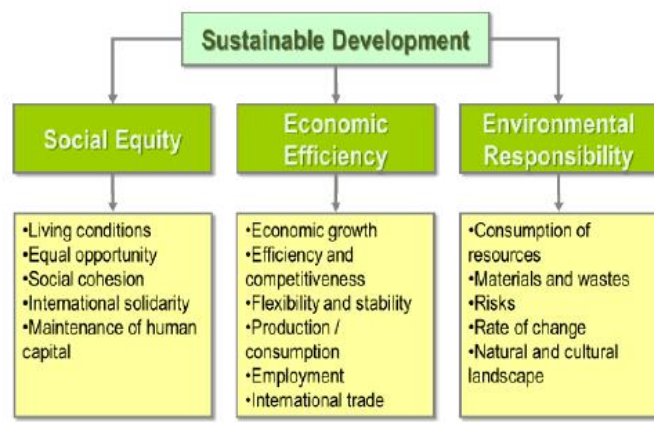
- ❖ Poor Governance; corruption;

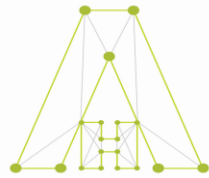
Core Values and Objectives of the AfriHub

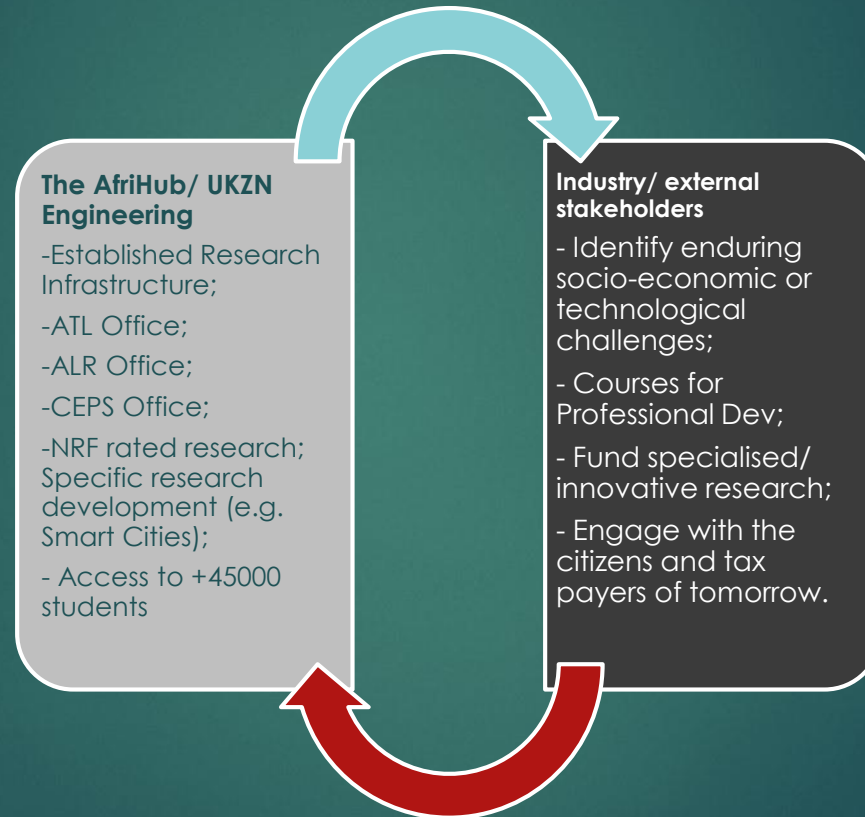

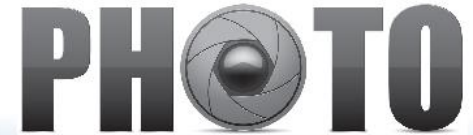

Through AfriHub, the University of KwaZulu-Natal can play a critical role in this regard through refocusing educational curricula, multi-disciplinary collaboration, improving training and skills development, fostering an entrepreneurial culture and leveraging greater value from its intellectual assets.

The Hub for the African City of the Future (AfriHub)

AfriHub is a strategic project under the UKZN's School of Engineering. The project pursues two overlapping objectives:

- Catalytic: To create value through innovative research and multi-disciplinary collaboration.
Transformative: To align the teaching and educational outcomes with market and societal needs.
Activities under the Hub will include the following:
Multiple-Engagement with Industry Stakeholders: Collaboration with industry partners will promote ideas, dialogue and collaboration which is essential for research to address complex social and technological challenges. Synergy across disciplines can result in better resource mobilisation.
Entrepreneurship Development: Entrepreneurs drive economic growth. Hence AfriHub must promote entrepreneurship skills to prepare learners for globalisation, increasing competition and dwindling resources.

- Building the Knowledge Economy through Philanthropic Engagement: Attracting financial resources to enhance the knowledge economy by funding workshops, projects, or Research Chairs, will form an integral part of the activities of the Hub.
Community Outreach: Key to the UKZN's social impact is community outreach. Progress is already underway through the CREATE programme between UKZN's Graduate School of Business & Leadership, School of Engineering and MIT. The aim is to capacitate SMEs in the KZN region.



University of KwaZulu-Natal Civil Support Fund #Knucs Cares!

LEGACY OF EXCELLENCE

We Inspire, We Educate, We Support, and We Care! This makes UKZN's Civil Engineering great!

With a legacy that extends to over half a century and reaches all over the world, graduates of Civil Engineering at former University of Natal and currently University of KwaZulu-Natal, have shared a trail of innovation, design and business successes across the globe.

To assure progression of this legacy visionary thinkers within the discipline started the KwaZulu-Natal University Civil Support (KNUCS) Fund in 1980. The aim of the Fund was to grow teaching and research excellence by supporting scholarship and academic skills at the University.

What KNUCS Does

The KNUCS Fund ensures sustainability of UKZN's Civil Engineering by attracting funding and in kind support from corporates and individuals within the Civil Engineering, Construction and Consulting sectors. Disbursements are decided by a steering committee comprising the Dean of Engineering, the Head of the Civil Engineering programme, and key members from industry: the Chair of the KZN Branch of SAICE, the Chair of KZN Branch of CESA, and the Head-Engineering of the eThekweni Municipality (or nominee).

The Steering Committee meets at least once a year (or more frequently if necessary) to decide on fund disbursements. A quorum requires the presence of at least 3 out of the 5 members of which at least 2 must be from the industry partners. Operating rules may be changed by the steering committee should this be necessary.

Supporting KNUCS benefits the University and Civil Engineering industry. Budget reallocation in higher education, difficulties attracting young, innovative staff to academia and limited resources for innovative research, poses serious challenges to the viability and sustainability of UKZN's Civil Engineering. Providing financial support to the KNUCS Fund will benefit the full value chain of Civil Engineering at UKZN sustaining excellence in graduates and research.

All donations when channelled through the UKZN Foundation, qualify for Section 18A Tax Exempt status and earn BBBEE scorecard points.
