**SUPPLY, MANUFACTURE AND ERECTION OF Y-TYPE PASSENGER SHELTERS
AT VARIOUS SITES WITHIN THE MSUNDUZI MUNICIPAL AREA**

The Msunduzi Municipality hereby invites tenders for the appointment of suitably experienced Service Providers for the supply, manufacture and erection of Y-Type passenger shelters at various sites within the Msunduzi Municipal area. **Tenderers shall have a minimum CIDB Contractor Grading of 2CE and/or 2GB, or higher to qualify to tender.**

Tender documents shall be available from the Supply Chain Management Unit Offices, 5thFloor, A S Chetty Building, 333 Church Street, Pietermaritzburg, from **12h00 on Thursday, 21 July 2011**. A non- refundable tender fee in the amount **R136.80** incl. VAT per document shall be levied. Only cash or bank guaranteed cheques will be accepted.

Sealed tenders, endorsed on the envelope “**Contract No. SCM 1 of 11/12**” must be placed in the Tender Box located in the Foyer, Ground Floor, City Hall, 169 Chief Albert Luthuli Street, Pietermaritzburg, not later than **12h00, on Thursday, 11 August 2011**, when they will be publicly opened. Only tenders placed in the Tender Box shall be accepted.

Tender Validity period: Ninety (90) days commencing from closing date of tender.

Tender Adjudication/Evaluation Criteria: A two-stage evaluation criteria will apply. Only tenders achieving a minimum threshold of 50% for functionality in the first stage will be considered in the second stage, where the 80/20 Preferential Points System will thereafter apply.

The Msunduzi Municipality does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender, and reserves the right to accept the whole or any part of a tender. Each tenderer will be informed of the tender result.

The Msunduzi Municipality expects businesses within the Pietermaritzburg and Midlands Region to support its contract and BEE/SMME initiatives.
