The Msunduzi Municipality hereby invites suitably experienced and qualified Contractors to tender for the above works.

A non- refundable tender fee in the amount **R 114.00** per document shall be levied. Only cash or bank guaranteed cheques will be accepted.

A compulsory **Site Inspection Meeting** will be held at **10h00**, on **Tuesday, 8 November 2011**. Prospective tenderers shall meet at the Oribi Airport (external Parking Lot), Pharazyn Way, Oribi. No tender shall be accepted from tenderers who do not attend the above meeting. No tender documents will be issued at the Site Inspection Meeting.

Sealed tenders endorsed on the envelope "**Quotation No. SCM Q26 of 11/12**" must be placed in the Tender Box located in the Foyer, Ground Floor, City Hall, 169 Chief Albert Luthuli Street, Pietermaritzburg, not later than **12h00** on **Friday, 11 November 2011**, when they will be publicly opened. Only tenders placed in the tender box shall be accepted.

The validity period for which the tender is to hold firm is a period of ninety (90) days from closing date of tender.

Evaluation and adjudication of the tender will be done in line with the Msunduzi Municipality's approved Supply Chain and Preferential Procurement Policies on the 80/20 point system.
