

PROTOCOL FOR TESTING POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

Employee Experiences Symptoms:

If an employee experiences any symptoms of a high fever, sore throat, a cough, shortness of breath or lack of smell and taste, they should immediately seek medical advice and treatment before coming to work.





Do NOT come to work:

COVID-19 is a notifiable disease and should an employee test positive for COVID-19 they must not come to work but self-isolate for 10 days.

Notify:

The positive employee must immediately inform their relevant Line Manager or Occupational Health Clinic and Compliance Officer of their positive status and provide a copy of their test results.





Self Isolation:

The positive employee must complete the self-isolate period of 10 days and after which, should they have no symptoms of COVID-19, they are to report to the Occupational Health Clinic BEFORE returning to their respective work sites.

Isolation of Direct Contacts:

All direct contacts of the positive employee must also self-isolate for 10 days. After which, the employees must report to the Occupational Health Clinic BEFORE to returning to their respective work sites.











Return to work:

All direct contacts may return to work after the 10 day self- isolation period provided they are symptom free, but they are required to first report to the Occupational Health Clinic BEFORE returning to their respective work sites.
